

Referendum:

Do you favor the granting of liquor licenses for the sale of liquor in South Annville Township, Lebanon County?

Plain English Statement:

Under Pennsylvania law, voters have the right to choose whether liquor licenses may be granted to businesses within a municipality. Currently, South Annville Township is a “dry” municipality. This means businesses within the Township are not allowed to obtain liquor licenses issued by the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board.

This ballot question, if approved by the voters, would authorize the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board (PLCB) to grant liquor licenses for the sale of beer, wine, and spirits to qualified restaurants, taverns, hotels, clubs, grocery stores, and other establishments within South Annville Township. If this question is approved, the number of licensed establishments located within South Annville Township and a business’s eligibility to obtain a license will be subject to the quota provisions of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board, the approval of the Liquor Control Board, and all other applicable laws.
